



STUDENT RIGHT-TO-KNOW

In accordance with the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965, as amended, the Student Right-to-Know Act, 34 CFR.668 requires that institutions receiving Title IV funding disclose graduation/completion rates for first time, full time students who completed within 150% of the normal time-to-completion. Federal reporting does not include students who have previously attended a higher education institution.

The Student-Right-to-Know rates are published annually by July 1st and based on data reported by First Institute in connection with the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) Survey. This information is available in the admissions office and on College Navigator, which is maintained by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) at:

GRADUATION RATES

The Student-Right-to-Know graduation rate is calculated based on full time first time certificate seeking students who enrolled between **September 1, 2018 and August 31, 2019**. The rate represents the number of students who earned their certificate of completion within 150% of the normal time frame.
