



STUDENT RIGHT-TO-KNOW

In accordance with the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965, as amended, the Student Right-to-Know Act, 34 CFR.668 requires that institutions receiving Title IV funding disclose graduation/completion rates for first time, full time students who completed within 150% of the normal time-to-completion. Federal reporting does not include students who have previously attended a higher education institution.

The Student-Right-to-Know rates are published annually by July 1st and based on data reported by First Institute in connection with the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) Survey. RETENTION RATES

The retention rate is a measure of the rate at which students persist in their educational program at an institution, expressed as a percentage and reported to the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)

The retention rate is the percentage of first-time students who were enrolled at any time between **August 1, 2020 and October 31, 2020**, who are still enrolled, or successfully completed their program.
